6. Project Description: The proposed project is a ten-unit apartment complex that would include two new multi-family buildings. The buildings would be located on a 90-foot wide, 554- to 560-foot long vacant lot on Appian Way. The two residential buildings would be sited lengthwise near the west boundary of the lot, perpendicular to the street. Each building would be 140 feet long, 32 feet wide, and up to 33 feet tall. Each building would be set back ten feet from the west property line to the

entrance steps and 15 feet from the property line to the building itself. The buildings would be set ten feet apart. Building One, located nearest Appian Way, would be set back 45 to 50 feet from the street. Building Two, in the interior of the lot, would have a one story, ten-foot long, ten-foot wide, and 12-foot tall office appended to its north end, and would be 101 feet from the northerly rear property line.

Each multiple-family building would have five 1,713-square-foot dwelling units. Each unit would have two bedrooms and two and a half bathrooms, above a two-car garage. The garages would accommodate individual trash and recycling containers, and therefore, an outdoor trash enclosure would not be needed. Pedestrian access to the units would be from step-up entrances along a four-foot wide sidewalk along the west boundary. Vehicular access to the garages would be from a 22-foot wide driveway along the east boundary. The driveway would have increased width in select locations to provide ten outdoor parking spaces and a turnaround to accommodate fire trucks and service vehicles. One of the parking spaces at the rear of the driveway would be an electric vehicle charging station, pursuant to the County Ordinance Code. A bicycle rack providing parking for four bicycles would also be located at the rear of the driveway.

The buildings would be of a contemporary Spanish revival architectural design and would have a smooth stucco finish painted in light earth tones and a light earth tone-colored tile roof. Building One would have a stucco-finished ten-foot tall wall that would extend 14 feet from the southwest end of the building towards the west to provide security for the project residents. The wall would have a gate to provide access to the apartments.

The vacant lot is currently devoid of any significant vegetation; however, an Arborist Report completed in August 2005 identified five trees on the lot, including an acacia, a plum, and three eucalyptus trees, which would be classified as protected trees under the County's Tree Protection and Preservation Ordinance. Accordingly, a Tree Permit would be processed as part of the project. The applicant would be required to submit and implement a landscaping and irrigation plan that includes replacement of the protected trees that have been removed

7. **Determination:** The County has determined that without mitigation the project may result in significant impacts to the environment. Therefore, pursuant to California Code of Regulations Section 15070, a Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared which identifies mitigation measures to be incorporated into the project that will reduce the impacts to less than significant levels. Prior to adoption of the Mitigated Negative Declaration, the County will be accepting comments on the Mitigated Negative Declaration/initial study during a 20-day public comment period.

A copy of the Mitigated Negative Declaration, initial study and all documents referenced therein may be reviewed in the offices of the Department of Conservation & Development during normal business hours, located at 30 Muir Road in Martinez.



VIA VERDI LANDSLIDE UPDATE

March 24, 2017

Dear Neighbors,

I am writing to provide you with another update on the landslide that is impacting the Via Verdi roadway.

Beginning Saturday morning, the City will build an emergency access road on the cemetery property.

The Via Verdi roadway condition continues to deteriorate. Prior to the latest rain storm, two cavities formed under the asphalt and sidewalk, in the vicinity of a storm drain manhole and adjacent drainage inlets. There is a risk that the cavities will grow due to the additional rain, or that the roadway subsidence will continue.

The proposed emergency access road will circumnavigate the landslide in a crescent shape, beginning roughly at the existing cemetery fire road gate, circling to the northeast and then east and then back southeast toward the roadway, and finally intersecting Via Verdi roughly behind the first residence located at the intersection of Via Verdi and Mozart Drive.

City staff will keep you informed of any additional developments.

VIA VERDI LANDSLIDE UPDATE

March 16, 2017

Dear Neighbors,

I am writing to provide you with a second update on the landslide that is impacting the Via Verdi roadway.

The slide appears to have developed on private property upslope of the roadway. The earth above the roadway continues to move and the roadway and utilities continue to be impacted.

City staff has been monitoring the Via Verdi roadway on a daily basis and has been making repairs in order to ensure the road and sidewalks are passable. Water and wastewater lines have been relocated above ground to ensure continued service.

Subsurface geotechnical investigations are ongoing and will likely take several weeks. Initial observations indicate that the slide is very deep; consequently the long term remedy may include extensive work on the adjacent private property.

If the situation worsens due to the forecasted rains, the City will take any immediate steps, including going onto the private property upslope of the roadway, which are necessary in order to preserve public safety.

City staff will continue daily monitoring, and we will keep you informed of any additional developments.

VIA VERDI LANDSLIDE UPDATE

March 3, 2017

Dear Neighbors,

I am writing to provide you with information on the landslide that is impacting the Via Verdi roadway.

The City is monitoring the landslide on a daily basis. To date, there is no indication of a catastrophic failure. The City will maintain the roadway and the sidewalk to ensure continuous, safe vehicular and pedestrian access to the neighborhood. The City will continue to monitor the situation and expects the roadway to remain open.

The slope movement uphill from, underneath, and downhill from the Via Verdi roadway has the potential to impact buried utilities. The City is working with East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD), West County Wastewater District (WCWD), and Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) to ensure utility services remain uninterrupted.

The City has hired a geotechnical engineering team to investigate the slope movement, beginning next week and continuing for a period of several weeks. The City will then continue to monitor the slope movement and will work with the geotechnical team to develop a remediation and mitigation program based on the results of the geotechnical investigations.

East Bay Parks: More than Just a Pretty Place


The 120,000 acres of the East Bay Regional Park District are more than just a pretty place. There are creeks that provide drinking water, trails to walk and ride that help us live healthy lives, and grasslands that are grazed which support the local food economy.

Winter Storm Damage


The heavy winter rains have caused severe damage in our parks, including landslides, washed out trails, erosion and downed trees. In some parks, flooding and rising lake waters have submerged trails, picnic areas, campgrounds, swim beaches and access to lake areas.

Storm damage was sustained in 29 Regional Parks as indicated in the map to the right. Damages are currently estimated at \$8.5 million.

Our park staff is working hard to get as many of the parks back to public access and recreation. However, some trails or access to recreational areas may take months or longer to restore, and will remain closed to ensure public safety. We appreciate your patience during this time. Please check our website frequently for current park conditions, such as trail closures, before visiting the parks.




Del Valle Regional Park Re-Opens April 15




